

Join ornithologist Ellie Roark at KLT's **Point of View cabin at 10 a.m. on Saturday, May 18**, for a guided hike across her bird migration study sites at Point Abbaye. Ellie is completing her second spring of bird survey work, this year comparing the effectiveness of her labor-intensive point and transect counts to those taken by audio recorders. Hike with Ellie to look for birds and learn about the life of a resident scientist at this rustic, remote setting and how the use of ARUs might benefit bird migration studies. Dress in layers and waterproof footwear and bring a lunch or snacks and drinking water. Event will conclude around 1:00 p.m. Take some time to explore the county park at Point Abbaye or other KLT protected near POV if you like. Ellie's study is funded by Copper Country Audubon and the Wilson Ornithological KLT Society and KLT provides her lodging.

GETTING THERE -- Point of View cabin at 2257 Point Abbaye Road: From downtown L'Anse, head NE on N Main Street (RIGHT at 4-way stop coming from US-41) which becomes the Skanee Road. Turn LEFT on Townline Road (at sign for Aura Festival). Turn RIGHT on Point Abbaye Road (at Pavement Ends sign). Travel about 10 miles to the drive into POV on LEFT (#2257 with KLT sign). Trip is about 60 miles and 1.5 hours from Houghton/Hancock area. Carpooling encouraged. Questions? Call KLT at 482-0820.
